Scripture Reflection

When Jesus says, “Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth,” He is not praising weakness. In the Bible, the word “meek” does not mean timid or powerless. It means someone who has strength but keeps that strength under God’s control.



A weak person gives in because they cannot stand against what is happening. A meek person can stand, but chooses patience, humility, and mercy. Weakness is surrendering to fear. Meekness is courage guided by love.

The meek are not silent about the truth. They are not passive about sin. They hunger for righteousness and remain firm in the faith. Yet they refuse to let anger rule them, pride harden them, or vengeance shape their actions. As the saints teach, it takes more strength to restrain yourself than to strike back. Christ Himself is our model. He spoke boldly against error. He stood unshaken before His enemies. And yet He was gentle of heart, forgiving those who harmed Him.

So what does this mean for us?

Be strong in what you believe. Learn your faith. Defend the truth with clarity. But do it with patience, kindness, and humility.

This week, choose one concrete act of meekness:

- Hold your tongue instead of speaking in anger.
- Forgive someone who has wronged you.
- Speak the truth without bitterness.
- Serve someone without seeking praise.

Ask God for a heart that is both strong and gentle, so that in your life others may see not weakness, but the strength of Christ.

Blessing of Throats

Each year the Church commemorates the feast of Saint Blaise, Bishop and Martyr celebrated on **February 3rd**. Because St. Blaise is the patron saint for the protection against throat diseases, **we will bless throats after Mass on Tuesday**. There will be a general blessing to the congregation on the following weekend, **February 7 & 8**.



St. Blaise is patron saint of diseases of the throat and other illnesses because he healed the boy who had a fishbone stuck in his throat by ordering him to cough it up.
