With Joy We Await!

This third Sunday of Advent is referred to as Gaudete Sunday meaning "rejoice." Our readings for today lead us to rejoice in the life that we have and more importantly the promise that we have been given. We start off once again with Isaiah telling us that the future is something that we all can rejoice in. He speaks about how



much we are subject to the conditions of weather, and living in a very arid country, this is no surprise. Therefore the provision of water in the wilderness is a common and joyous expression of praise in the books of the prophets. He speaks of the parched land of the desert in full bloom all because of God's love for us. The coming of water to dry places, no less than the ransom of captives, promises renewed prospects for human survival in a dangerous world.

James in his letter reminds us that just as we cannot predict the weather, we must be patient and wait. He does not liken the "coming of the Lord' to the rains, but rather compares the patience of believers to that of the farmer who must wait for the rains. The rains will not arrive any sooner simply because the farmer wishes it; they will come when they come. So too will it be with the coming of Christ. We all must be patient and simply wait. It is in the gospel for this week that we are given the information about how we are to wait and what we are to do.

We find that John is in prison as Matthew presents our gospel for this week. He is wondering if Jesus is truly the "one" who is to come. The question this leaves us is: how can John the Baptist, Christ's forerunner and the man Jesus himself greeted as the greatest ever born from a woman, be so unsure now? In a way it is good for us to see that John had to adapt to Jesus' views, and not Jesus to John's. Jesus always comes and works in the most unexpected ways.

John's question must become our own: Is Jesus the One for us, or are we really looking for another? In trying to answer the question of Jesus' identity we cannot rely only on the authority of others found in creeds or catechisms. Our answer must also come from our own personal experience of Jesus and the good fruit of his life and ministry. Advent is a time when we can open our eyes to see in new ways the presence of Jesus - in good actions, in the holiness of others, in forgiveness and healing. Yes, we see Jesus when we see the fruits of his presence. Living the Gospel, means that we are charged to take up Jesus' ministry, we cannot ask people to take our word for it; our actions or non-actions speak for us. Either we take up Jesus' ministry or we don't. Either people see Jesus in us, or they don't. We grow into witnessing to Jesus' life and mission when we ourselves seek to answer the question, "Are you the one...?" by personally encountering Christ in prayer and opening ourselves to recognizing him in our own and others' good works. We cannot know someone whom we have never encountered.

Nietzsche once said that one of the major obstacles to believing in Christ is that Christians do not reflect the joy of his Resurrection. This Sunday offers us a wonderful opportunity to ask ourselves whether we live our faith joyfully or not. It is sometimes difficult today to be optimistic about the future of our Christian communities, but who said it was ever easy? Jesus performs miracles, and still people doubt. Are we dreaming of a salvation completely out of this world or are we ready to adjust our own dreams to those of God as embodied in the life and ministry of Jesus?

I think that as a parish family we can feel good about the ways that we reach out into our community and share our goodness.


