

## The Lord is good...

We find ourselves back in Ordinary time and we begin this season with the proclamation that "The Lord is good: his kindness endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations." Throughout the history of the people of Israel, this has proven to be true over and over. We start our liturgy this week by listening to the Book of Exodus telling Moses to



relate to the people of Israel that throughout their history, when they remembered to be true to the covenant, Yahweh always led them to a good place. It was when they forgot the Promises of Mercy that God gave to them, that they found themselves in need. God establishes a covenant with the children of Israel. In the second reading we find St. Paul reiterating this same sentiment in reference to Christ. He reminds us that God proves his love for us through the person of Jesus, and offers us forgiveness.

Through the death and resurrection of Jesus we all find salvation if we are true to His words. The real challenge this week comes to us through the words of the Gospel. Jesus speaks to his followers and reminds them that: "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few, so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." He then commissions the disciples and commands them to go out to all lands and make this proclamation: "The kingdom of heaven is at hand.

Jesus reminds all of us to offer compassion to the people in our world, to touch the people around us with kindness, mercy and love, a command that too often in life we overlook. We are much like the people of Israel in the sense that we are ok when things are good, but the minute trouble enters our lives we forget about this great command.

It is difficult to look at all of God's creation and look at the people in it with compassion. It is problematic to offer forgiveness when we have been hurt or offended. We can be stubborn when it comes to accepting all of God's children. As always the message is clear but it is a whole different matter to make it a part of our lives. We all need to take the time and make the effort to reflect over our lives and remember those times when we have experienced Gods mercy and forgiveness. Those times when we were so lost and all of a sudden God makes things right. Every one of us have certainly experienced that goodness of God in our lives.

Sometimes we just need to remember to pause in life and ask for God's direction. When we remind ourselves of this great

command to be compassionate, there we will find our answers. We are all called upon to open ourselves up to the world around us. Too often we seem to get "stuck" on our own issues and problems and that is where we remain. By opening ourselves up to the greater picture, we clearly see the compassion and wonder of God's presence.
