People of Wisdom

What a comfort it is to sit down and think about the Wisdom literature and see how it applies to our lives today. These ancient writings speak to our hearts about how we should relate to one another. One of the most noticea-



ble aspects about this literature is that is includes all people, making us all responsible to one another with no separations or divisions. Our liturgy today presents us with an excerpt from the Book of Wisdom telling us what a precious gift wisdom is, and how it can influence our lives in ways that can bring us peace.

Did you ever meet a person who you thought was genuinely wise, and if so, what was it about them that made you think they were wise? I have always heard that age brings wisdom and I do believe there is truth to that. When we are young we think that we can do absolutely everything, driving ourselves crazy trying to meet everyone's expectations. As we get older we learn to let go and know what is important and what is not. This is the wisdom that comes with life.

Jesus gives us a parable reminding us how important wisdom can be when we look at life in relation to the end. To be wise is to be prepared, ready for the unexpected. This doesn't mean that we need to be prepared for anything that might pop up in life; it means that we should have the wisdom to be able to handle any unexpected events. We are given the example of ten bridesmaids waiting for the return of the bride groom. While half of them were wise in being prepared for the unexpected delay, the other half simply were not ready when he came.

Although Jesus is referring to the end of times, we can certainly learn from this parable about being ready and prepared in life. There are so many things that we keep putting off in life. Waiting for more time and more money, or just waiting until we feel the time is right before we act. With all of our great planning, isn't it amazing how often we have been surprised and caught off guard by not being prepared!

Once again I think that Jesus is telling us not to sweat the small stuff. We need to focus our attentions onto what really matters and is important in life. Sometimes it is harder to let go of the little things than it is to be attentive to the important mat-

ters of life. This week we are all being challenged to become wise people, to look at our lives and be able to ascertain what is important and what isn't. If we all are able to focus on the things that really matter in life, maybe life would be a lot simpler and certainly more peaceful. To be prepared is to be at peace with where we are in life and what we have in life, so that when the bride groom does come we will not be surprised.
