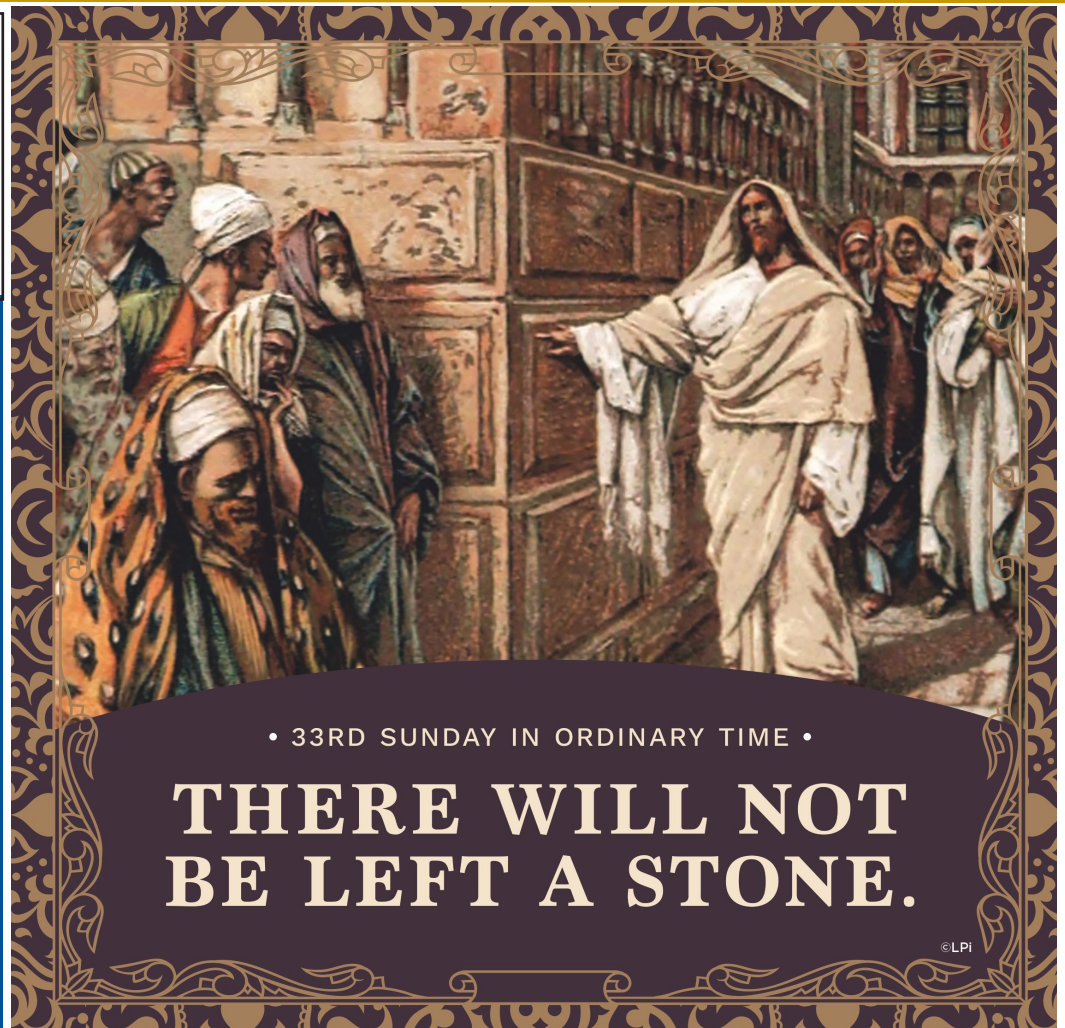

Scripture Reflection

From Fr. Anthony Onoko:

Pay Attention to Yourselves

POPE ST. LEO THE GREAT, MONDAY, NOVEMBER 10, 2025

WEEK 32, YEAR 1

WIS: 1:1-7; PSALM 129; LUKE 17:1-6

Today, we begin reading from the Book of Wisdom, one of the beautiful wisdom books in the Bible. We shall read from it throughout this week, from Monday, November 10, until Saturday, November 15.

The Book of Wisdom was written in Greek around the mid-first century (about 50 BCE) by a devout Jew living in Alexandria, Egypt. Because it was not written in Hebrew and was composed outside the Holy Land, it is not included in the Jewish canon, but the Church has always treasured it as inspired and deeply spiritual.

It was written for rulers and for young Jews living among pagan influences, to encourage them to seek divine wisdom and to remain faithful to the God of Israel. Its main themes are:

- The nature and value of wisdom
- The suffering and reward of the righteous
- God's providence and mercy
- The folly of idolatry

In today's passage we read:

“Wisdom will never make its way into a crafty soul.” (Wisdom 1:4)

This is a striking line. It tells us that God desires to fill us with His wisdom, one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, but He will not pour it into hearts that are deceitful, proud, or closed to His truth. God's wisdom can only dwell in a heart that is pure, sincere, and humble.

This connects perfectly with the Gospel where Jesus says, “Pay attention to yourselves.” (Luke 17:3) He is warning us to be alert, to watch over our hearts and conduct, so that we do not cause others to stumble or block God's grace in our lives.

To “pay attention to ourselves” means to be spiritually awake, to notice when anger, bitterness, unforgiveness, pride, or dishonesty begin to take root. These are the very things that drive away God's wisdom and peace.

If we truly want God's wisdom to guide our lives, we must keep our hearts clean and attentive to His presence within us.

ST. LEO THE GREAT

Today, the Church celebrates Pope St. Leo the Great, a man whose life radiated divine wisdom. Born in Etruria, he became Pope in the year 440 and led the Church during one of its most difficult times. He defended the faith against heresies, especially Monophysitism, and at the Council of Chalcedon (451 AD) his famous letter affirmed Christ's true humanity and divinity, strengthening the unity of the Church. He was a man of deep prayer, humility, courage, and love for the poor.



May the example and prayers of St. Leo the Great inspire us to seek God's wisdom, to live humbly and courageously, and to serve others in love.

Wisdom Nugget

It is useful to serve God. God sees, God remembers. God rewards.
