

### Going out on a limb!

Sometimes we forget that the simple things in life make all the difference. We spend time looking for the "big" things and we completely miss out on the opportunities that the "simple" things bring to life. Our liturgy gives us a gentle reminder that God



loves everyone because they are all God's creation, and the good found in them reflects the goodness of God.

The first reading from Wisdom gives us a wonderful explanation of God's plan for creation. The book was written for those Jewish people who spoke Greek about a century before the birth of Jesus. The Jewish people were under continual assault by pagan Greeks and this book was written to strengthen their faith. Not only were the Jewish people confronted by their pagan neighbors, but they also had to deal with those Jews who had left their faith. Today's reading reminds us of the splendor and beauty of divine wisdom. God shows a merciful readiness to overlook sinful offenses from humans. This gentleness on the part of God manifests a love for all that God created. Our gospel speaks of God's mercy in another way. Through the writings of Luke we are faced with the story of Zacchaeus. Simply put, this is a story about the problem of riches, Jesus' concern for those who are outcast, and for those who have faith to recognize who Jesus is. The central figure in the story is a tax collector. Needless to say, Zacchaeus was not a well-liked man; in fact we would be correct in saying that he was probably hated by most of the people.

Whatever faults Zacchaeus may have been guilty of, it took a lot of courage for him to mingle with the people who, knowing his profession, might have stoned him. Zacchaeus was one of those "lost" people we hear so much about in the gospels. To clarify what it meant to be "lost" in the scriptures, it certainly did not mean damned or doomed. Rather, it meant in the wrong place. A thing or a person becomes lost when we find it in a place other than where it should be. When we find it, we return it to the place it ought to occupy. A person is lost when they have wandered away from God, but when they are found, they take their rightful place in the household of faith. Zacchaeus was in the wrong place in his life and apparently he knew it. He could only encounter Jesus by going out on a "limb." Zacchaeus had to go out on a limb to make a change in his life. Jesus calls him by name and suddenly he finds himself in the right place.

How do we go out on a limb to find Jesus? In what ways do we need to change and grow to become more aware of God's mercy? We are all called to believe in the essential goodness of all that God created. Wisdom calls us to embrace an attitude of reverence for all of creation; how we treat the environment, animals and all other aspects of ecology. Created in God's image, we are now the stewards of creation.
