## How well do we tend the Vineyard?

One of the amazing realities about being a disciple is that we are never really done. Once we think we have everything figured out, we must look again because there is much more to learn. Today we are reminded about the bounty of God's goodness. We are



given the example of a vineyard, one prepared by God with tender and loving care. We have been put here on that vineyard to take care of it. Often we think that our responsibility is to care for one another and treat all people in a genuinely loving manner. That is only part of it, for the vineyard is made up of more than just people.

Isaiah in this beautiful poem portrays God as a tender friend who lovingly cares for the vineyard. Despite all the tender, loving care, the spading, the clearing of stone, the planting, the building of a watchtower – all symbols of the loving, down-to-earth quality of God's love – the quality of the people's response is symbolized by a vineyard overgrown with thorns and thistles and a rotten harvest. The Lord looks for justice and finds violence and bloodshed. God prepares us to bring forth good fruit from our labors but our behavior sometimes renders our work and devotion fruitless. One may think of the vineyard as valuable property, the produce of which could be used to bring justice to the society and insure an equitable distribution of goods. This has not happened!

Often we become so enveloped in our own problems and issues that we fail to appreciate the beauty of all that is around us. Have you ever had the experience where you get into your car to go somewhere, then, once you are there you have no recollection of how you got there? You were so caught up in your own world that you didn't even notice the beauty that is around you. This is what Isaiah is talking about in the first reading and what Jesus refers to in the Gospel. We all need to feel a greater appreciation and responsibility in caring for the earth and all that is contained on it. The justice of Jesus speaks of taking care of all that God has blessed us with. This means that we have to appreciate the world in which we live.

As a society, we abuse the resources that have been entrusted to us. We don't think enough about how we are to cultivate the land in which we live. We think nothing of the gasoline we burn or the trash that we throw around. We waste so many of

the gifts that we have been given without even a second thought. Today we are reminded that it is our responsibility to care for and cultivate the vineyard. We all are called to be responsible not only to the people we live with but also to the world in which we live. All that we have has been freely given to us. The very least we can do is respond to those gifts with the same tender appreciation in the same manner in which it was given.
