Where two or more are gathered...

Sometimes it is good to get back to the basics of what we are about as people. Today our liturgy reminds us that it is the simple things, the way we relate to others that is important. Once again we are reminded that it is not about "us" in life, it is about how we relate to one an-



other. Ezekiel in the first reading makes one of the most significant contributions to the theology of ancient Israel by letting the people know that everyone is accountable for his or her own faults and not for those of the past generations. Paul in the second reading makes it clear that love, and love only, "is the fulfillment of the law." Paul remains convinced that mutual love within the community should be solidly anchored in the love of God: I am convinced that neither death, nor life, not angels, nor principalities, not present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of god in Christ Jesus our Lord." Although Paul speaks of the "law" in not so positive terms, the real question is do we keep the commandments for the right motivation: love. It is easy to follow any law simply because it is law and we can easily lose sight of the love that should be behind our actions.

In our gospel for this week we are shown just how the church is to live within this law of love in and through reconciliation. The gospel of Matthew has often been noted as the "church gospel," and this week we can clearly see the author's strong concern about the life of the community. Matthew tells us that the church should not be a place for complacency and self-satisfaction but for seeking greater commitment to the gospel of Christ.

None of us likes to be "called on the carpet." It may mean that we must submit our will to another. It also may mean that we have to face up to the fact that we aren't perfect in spite of the fact that we tend to see the wrong in another before we recognize wrong in ourselves. Today, Jesus speaks to us about being called on the carpet. Giving and receiving corrections is one of the hardest things we can do. The last line of the gospel gives us a clue as to what underlying motivation is really the strongest: "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." We must always remember that it is not us that are the reconcilers; it is the power of Christ acting through us that brings about peace. It is always about keeping harmony within the Body of Christ. As Christ's church we are all responsible for one another even when that responsibility calls us to help others with their faults and weaknesses. It is our task in life to bring the calming peace of Christ to all of our brothers and sisters no matter what the cost may be. As we pray this weekend it would be good just to look around and see who is a part of our worshipping family. Each of us is connected to one another and we are all responsible for the welfare of each other.

Know Him On Thursday, September 21, travel back to Jesus' time at Christ Our Shepherd Center, Greensburg and become a stunned disciple. As part of the Eucharistic Revival, the Diocese is offering the Know Him series. Receive a guided tour of the weaponry of Jesus' passion and death in our Diocesan Heritage Center from Fr. Charles Sampson of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, Discover the plight of Christians in the Holy Land today from Roni Salsa, a Palestinian Christian from Bethlehem, ans explore some of the Eucharistic Miracles catalogued by Blessed Carlo Acutis, There are two sessions.
