

## How do I live wisely?

Imagine if you can a world where everyone thinks and acts the same way that we do. Everyone has the save values from which they live; they have similar attitudes and opinions. If we were all on the same page then there wouldn't be conflict or hurt feelings. This sounds



nice and it would be a wonderful way to live life, but that is simply not reality. We are all individuals with our own opinions and ways of living, we all have our own expectations as to how others should live and conduct their affairs. We are unique and we all have our faults and weaknesses as well as strengths and gifts. As people we bump shoulders and step on toes, we do offend others sometimes without even knowing it. When we are offensive to another we usually feel justified in our opinions and we almost expect people to forgive us when we do them wrong. However, when the shoe is on the other foot and people offend us, we are not so ready to offer forgiveness or understanding.

Sirach in our first reading this week reminds us that we hold tight to injuries and we are not so quick to offer forgiveness even though we expect to be forgiven when we show remorse. The book of Sirach comes from Israel's Wisdom literature, in the book Sirach observes ordinary circumstances of life and addresses the question: "How do I live wisely?" This is this question we all need to be asking ourselves. Today's reading deals with anger, vengeance and forgiveness and how God responds to them

Anger can be a powerful feeling in life and when we are not aware of it, can lead to vengeance, and even more severe behavior and attitudes. In his wisdom Sirach invites all people not to hold on to anger or seek any type of revenge. Rather seek always towards forgiveness and reconciliation. He also points out the simple fact that we are all in need of forgiveness not only from one another but also from God.

The Gospel for this week deals with the issue of just how often must we forgive. Again, this is a part of life that we all have dealt with in our lives. How much do we have to take before we bite back? As Jesus answers Peter's question he points out the simple mission of the church, to forgive one another as we have been forgiven. This sums up the teachings of Jesus very clearly. We are to embrace one another with a forgiving heart and a reconciling spirit; not an easy thing to do! We all should spend a little time thinking about the grudges we hold against others, the hurts we harbor, and the anger that we allow to control us. Why do we hold onto such things, they bring no good to anyone? Jesus asks us to forgive seventy times seventy, or not to put any limits as to how often we are to forgive. Jesus goes to great length in pointing out how extravagant God's mercy and forgiveness are, we are all being asked the question as to how far our mercy goes and to whom do we extend forgiveness. Sirach has it right when we are asked how to live wisely. If we only took the time and made the effort to find answers to that question maybe we would all be a lot better off in life.
