



## What it means to serve the "least" among us?

In the first reading this week taken from the book of wisdom we are told that the people wanted to "put the just one to the test." The wicked people had a hard time tolerating the just one because he was a constant reminder to them of what was good. Those



who were considered "wicked" were wanting to test God to see if he would save the just one, and if not then they felt justified in thinking that they were right all along. In the Book of Wisdom the wicked ones were the people who had a hard time acknowledging God's action and presence in the world.

St. James in the second reading reminds us that Christian Wisdom means living in sync with God's plan, and way too often we allow many forms of discord to disrupt this wisdom, or way of living. We look around and see that frequently jealousy and self-ish ambition become our guiding light which can lead us to much unrest in life.

Jesus in the Gospel addresses these issues with his Disciples reminding them that misguided ambition and jealousy have no place in God's Kingdom and he uses a child as an example of the point he is trying to make. He tells his Disciples that unless they become like a little child, with no jealousy, ambition, or need for power and control, they are missing the whole point of his message. By example Jesus shows how we are to live with humility and the true meaning of greatness. We are to be last and the servant of all if we are serious about following the commands Jesus puts before us.

Jesus, the teacher and master tells his followers that they must be attentive to the least esteemed of society, the children. This example caused the disciples to stop and think about what it was they valued in life, their own concerns and interests or those of the people they served. Jesus shows us how God sets all greatness aside and embraces that little child that resides in every one of us. Jesus certainly makes all of us aware of the absurdity of our ambitions, disagreements and torments that unsettle our communities and families.

Today, our church certainly has shown what ambition and power can do and the damage that it can cause, a lesson we all need to learn from. For this reason the Church has adopted the policy to protect the least among us (our children) in every way that it possibly can. It is a sad testimony to our society that steps have to be taken to ensure that our children are protected. In following through with this notion, the Church requires that all volunteers receive training and acquire clearances.

I realize that this can be an inconvenience for all of us, and that many people rather than obtain the required clearances will simply refuse to volunteer. It is hard enough for people to find time to volunteer, and then to add this additional burden it can seem overwhelming. However, the clearances do not take that long to complete. The state has made this mandatory for any volunteer working around children, so it is not just in the Church. Sometimes we need to step back and look at the "spirit" of the law or requirements and not simply the "letter" of what is being asked.

Granted this is just one more thing that we have to deal with, but when you stack everything up, it really isn't asking a lot. If you have any issues with this, I do hope you will contact me and we can discuss it. Like the disciples gathered around Jesus who had to surrender many of their attitudes towards life, we too are called upon to do the same. In order for us to help build a stronger Kingdom of God, we all need to work together and working together means dealing with what we've got. Like the Wisdom of the Old Testament tells us, our lives need to reflect attitudes of humility and love. All of us are called upon to share the gifts God has given us, no matter what the cost might be.

### **Bible Study**
